★ Nursery

AOI: Healthy and unhealthy Food- Nursery students learned how healthy food helps to keep their bodies strong and promotes overall wellness. ★ LOWER SECONDARY: Grades 6 to 8:


★ Grade 6: English

UNFORGETTABLE EXPERIENCE: OUR PRINCIPAL'S UNCONVENTIONAL APPROACH: DISCOVERING THE STORY OF

RAMAYANA: Objective: Learn the features of a mythology and comment on the writer's intended meaning and themes. In a unique initiative, our Principal took to the classroom, blending team teaching with storytelling and interactive games. As a part of the unit titled 'Myths and Legends', students of grade 7 participated in an immersive learning experience as they gained significant insights on the Ramayana in their English class. Padmajaa Ma'am demonstrated the role of team teaching along with our English teacher, Ms. Princia and our Biology teacher, Ms Rashmi. Our mentors collaborated to provide students with a holistic learning experience through an interesting picture narration activity. It was a complete ode to the value of the week,'Cooperation', emphasising the significance of learning family values from Indian mythology and following them in our lives. The Gurukul system was also implemented to inculcate the fundamentals of traditional learning environments and educate students about their advantages. Some Yoga exercises to be practiced daily were also demonstrated. To recapitulate, the 'Flip Flap' activity was adopted, where the learners were encouraged to enhance their questioning skills to guess the characters correctly. Amar Chitra Katha was introduced to the students as a recommendation for reading. 


★ Grade 6: Collaborative Activity: French and Art








★ Grade 7 : Global Perspectives Global vs Local Brands






\bigstar Grade 8: Global Perspectives :

Moving Stories!

As part of the Global Perspectives' Challenge, learners of Grade 8 had to prepare a questionnaire and interview someone who migrated. The objective of this activity was to learn to formulate a questionnaire and conduct an interview. Before conducting the interview, learners got their questions approved. The next step was the interview. With great enthusiasm learners recorded the interviews of their family members, relatives, friends etc. and presented their findings. Through this activity, learners learnt to frame a questionnaire and communicate effectively. Very often, learners do not know the rich history of their family or stories of their humble beginnings, through this activity learners got an opportunity to gain insight on the reasons for migration and hardships their loved ones had to face after migrating.



★ IGCSE: Grade 9

Economics Activity - Mind Space

This class activity was held within the classroom premises, with an objective to engage the students in a fun filled activity laced with important learning goals. All the students of Grade 9 participated in the event with their teacher as a mentor. The activity gave a platform for our students to showcase their critical thinking and use of language while collaborating English with Economics to further help them imbibe key Economics terminologies. Reflection of students displayed their skills of critical thinking, collaboration and oral presentation based on sentence formation, focusing on keywords while using synopsis. It was a good learning experience where students engaged with their innovative abilities to present sentences or phrases to each other to identify the Economic terms or formulas or skills through this activity. The class activity also helped our students to get a sense of appreciation of how important it is to develop a word pool that can not only help develop one's vocabulary but also broaden its use. The students through the flip-flap activity in Grade 9 got hands -on experience of life skills like being kind through not only words but also gestures can really help in raising a sense of positivity through this activity. Taking things ahead through the day keeping this thought in mind helped the students sharpen their perspectives.









* A Levels: Grade 12: Chemistry - Electrochemical cell

A level students carried out an engaging experiment focused on the construction and analysis of an electrochemical cell. The experiment involved the use of zinc and copper electrodes to create the cell, with the objective of understanding the fundamental principles of electrochemistry. To measure the cell's potential difference, students connected the setup to a voltmeter. Additionally, they prepared a salt bridge using a mixture of agar gel and sodium chloride (NaCl), which facilitated the flow of ions between the two half-cells and maintained electrical neutrality. In the cell, zinc acted as the anode, serving as the negative terminal, while copper functioned as the cathode, connected to the positive terminal of the voltmeter. Through this experiment, students gained valuable insights into the workings of electrochemical cells, enhancing their understanding of redox reactions and the flow of electrons in electrochemical systems. Furthermore, the hands-on activity helped them differentiate between electrochemical and electrolytic cells, deepening their comprehension of the key distinctions between these two types of cells.



★ PRE PRIMARY: Sr Kg

'Learning to be Road Smart!'

On September 19, 2024, the Senior KG students enjoyed a fun and educational field trip to Traffic Park as part of their inquiry into road safety. Traffic Park is designed to teach young children about basic traffic rules and road safety in an interactive and engaging manner. During the visit, the children explored mini roads, traffic lights, and pedestrian crossings. They gained hands-on experience in safely crossing the road, the importance of wearing seat belts, and understanding traffic signals—all within a safe, controlled environment.

The park featured role-playing activities that allowed the kids to act as pedestrians, helping them understand their responsibilities on the road. This playful approach enabled them to learn essential life skills while having fun. Teachers and park guides facilitated discussions and games to reinforce the lessons learned, ensuring that the children not only enjoyed themselves but also gained practical knowledge about traffic safety.

WAVES OF CHANGE: BEACH CLEANUP DAY: IGCSE and A LEVELS

Our SEWA initiative added another feather to its cap by participating in the International Coastal Cleanup drive on 21 September, 2024 held at the Versova Beach, Andheri from 7.30 am to 9.00 am. The drive was organised by the Afroz Shah Foundation that aims to mitigate global warming and reduce plastic pollution.

The objective of participating in this beach cleanup drive was to bring about awareness amongst the students of MBIS of the enormous amount of plastic and other forms of waste found on our beaches and how oblivious we as a community are to this reality because we think it doesn't affect us directly.

To achieve this, the students of Grades 9 to A Levels left as early as 6.45 am for the beach. On arriving at the beach, the students were given gloves to wear so that they can go about cleaning without fear of any infection. Our students hit top gear in an instant wherein they fetched buckets from the organizers and began dumping the waste they collected into it. The cleanup drive activity was held till 9.00 am post which all volunteers and participants were provided water and refreshments. It was a daunting task and although there is so much more left to be cleaned, through sheer determination and team effort much was achieved by our students. One important lesson for our students was that if the beaches need to be kept clean, waste disposal needs to be handled better.













★ Lower Secondary : Grade 7

Life Skills: (Value of the week) - Co-operation

'The value of life is not based on how long we live, but how much we contribute to others in our society.'

The activities based on value of the week were designed to promote collaborative problem-solving and decision making. Students were divided in to small groups and tasked with completing a series of interactive challenges such as:

- a. Poem on Cooperation Students creatively presented their ideas and thoughts on co-operation.
- b. Story telling Students enacted a story which taught the value of Cooperation amongst students.
- **c. Critical thinking -** Students gave away a situation .Their classmates empthasized themselves in the situation and gave their opinions as to what they would have done in that case.

Through this activity, students developed effective communication skills, problem solving strategies, empathy and understanding of different perspectives.









★ LOWER SECONDARY: Grade 8

Empathy - Walk in someone else's shoes!

The value for the first week of September was Empathy. Through this value the aim was to sensitise the learners about Empathy as a life skill. Grade 8 learners were asked the meaning of empathy on day 1. Very often learners confuse empathy with sympathy. The value was further dealt with by learners presenting their understanding about the difference between empathy and sympathy. In the third session, learners were shown a video of a personality who epitomises Empathy-Mother Teresa. Learners delved deeper into understanding the value through group enactment, where each group enacted scenarios given to them where they had to showcase empathy in relevant circumstances focusing on issues like bullying, disrespectfulness.









★ IGCSE: Grade 9

An Act of Kindness

An act of kindness activity was conducted with children, where they were asked to take pictures of acts of kindness at home. They then created a PowerPoint presentation (PPT) to showcase these acts, such as feeding a dog, helping with homework, and providing stationery to the needy. The activity was carried out in two groups, with each group presenting in sequence. Through this, students reflected on how kindness can be practiced in daily life, raising their awareness of its importance.

Teacher Enrichment Programme:

POCSO workshop: Awareness on Protection of Children from Sexual Offences

"Empowering a safer future: Together we protect, educate, and nurture."

A workshop on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act was held for the teaching and administrative staff by Ms. Neelu Grover, Safety and sexuality educator. The session focused on educating the staff about the provisions of the POCSO Act, which aims to protect children from sexual abuse. The facilitator explained how to identify red flags, such as behavioral changes, anxiety, and physical signs that may indicate a child is experiencing abuse. She emphasized the responsibility of school staff in recognizing and responding to these signs while ensuring the child's privacy and well-being. In addition, the session guided the staff on seeking professional help, such as reporting to designated

authorities, involving child protection services, and accessing counseling support. Staff were reminded of their legal obligations under the Act and the importance of creating a safe school environment. The workshop served as an essential step toward equipping staff with the knowledge to protect children and address any signs of abuse effectively.
